Students of every major must satisfy that major's upper-division Disciplinary Communication (DC) requirement. The DC requirement will be met with HAVC 100A.

Senior Comprehensive Requirement

All seniors must complete one seminar, 190–191, as their “senior exit” course to satisfy the senior comprehensive requirement. Seminars can be taken for senior exit credit only by permission of the instructor. Within the context of this advanced seminar, students will produce carefully supervised work culminating in the completion of a written project that meets the standards of the senior level of achievement in the major.

Seniors enrolled in a HAVC seminar who would like to take the class to fulfill their senior comprehensive must have the instructor's permission by the third week of quarter. Students must submit a signed Senior Exit Requirement petition form (available in the HAVC office) to the HAVC undergraduate adviser by the fourth week of the quarter.
